King James the GOAT

LeBron Raymone James is a professional basketball player for the Los Angeles Lakers. LeBron was drafted into the NBA straight out of high school and was taken with the #1 pick overall with his hometown team the Cleveland Cavaliers. He's a 15x NBA All-Star, a 3x NBA Champion, 6x All-NBA defensive team member, 3x All-Star game Most Valuable Player (MVP), a 4x league MVP, 15x All-NBA team member, 2003-04 All Rookie first team member, 3x Finals MVP, he won the NBA scoring title in 2007-08 and won Rookie of the Year award for the 2003-04 season. His career averages are 27.2 points per game (PPG), 7.2 assists per game (APG) and 7.4 rebounds per game (RPG). These are just some of the statistical reasons why he is considered the Greatest of all Time (GOAT). LeBron also opened a public school worth \$8 million for at risk students in the Akron, Ohio area. The students there get free bikes, free meals and college tuition paid for. This is how he is considered the GOAT off the court.

Some people might consider Michael Jordan or Kobe being the GOAT but LeBron has a total of 32,543 points for his career while Michael has 32,292 total points. He is exactly 1,100

points away from passing Kobe for 3rd All-Time. LeBron is also the only person in NBA history to be Top 10 all-time in Points & Assist (8,662). Although he is entering his 17th season some people called his latest season a down year for him when he averaged 27.4 PPG , 8.5 RPG & 8.3 APG. In one of his MVP seasons he averaged 26.8 PPG , 8 RPG & 7.3 APG. When comparing these two seasons one might question how his latest season was his down year when he put up better numbers than in his MVP season. Despite the fact that he only has 3 NBA Championships he appeared in 9 NBA Finals and went 8 straight times from the 2010 season to the 2018 season. He holds one of the highest streaks of making it to the NBA finals. In the 2018 NBA Playoffs he had one of the most remarkable runs while doing it all by himself. He averaged 34 PPG, 9 APG & 8.8 RPG while leading his team to the NBA Finals where they lost to the Golden State Warriors 4 man all-star team.

Off the court LeBron gives back to his hometown with every chance he gets. “When I graduated from St. Vincent - St. Mary high school in Akron, Ohio in 2003, I PROMISED to never forget where I came from”(James 1). LeBron pledged \$1 million to help renovate his alma mater’s gym where he grew up playing. With that money he also purchased new jerseys for all sports teams to wear with LeBron James’ logo on them. With the I Promise School LeBron plans to invest in children’s lives in the Akron area. He also built the I Promise Institute on the University of Akron campus where he looks to not only help kids get to college but also to graduate college.

The students at the I Promise School has shown extraordinary results. Third graders went from the first percentile to the 18th percentile in Math while fourth graders went from the second percentile to the 30th percentile in Math. 90% of students who started the school year at least one

year behind grade level met or exceeded their expected growth in math and reading. All of this could not have happened though without LeBron James.

To conclude LeBron has done much on the court as he did off the court. He believed in himself when no one else did and he believed in the at risk kids when nobody else did. That is why LeBron James is considered the Greatest of all Time.

Saving Money 101

Are you bad at saving money? Do you sometimes wish you had a little extra spending money in your pocket? Well according to CNBC 65% of Americans save little to no money. There's a bunch of ways you could save money. You could open up a savings account, you could go out less during the week, eat at home or simply even sell any items that aren't getting put to use anymore. Do you want to be apart of the 65% of people who don't save money or the 35% that do save money? The choice is yours.

The first step on how to manage your budget is to recognize that you do have a spending problem. Most people can't recognize that they have a spending problem and some people get paid weekly so they have a thought in their head that they get paid every Friday so why look back. If you can acknowledge that you have a problem then you can stop the problem a little earlier than later. Remember it all starts with no one else but you.

The second step in managing ones budget is to open up a savings account. Some banks give you an option if you would want to transfer funds from your checking account to your savings account every month. Also you must remember to never spend the money in your savings account and only spend the money in your checking account. The money in your savings

account is of course only for emergencies. By opening up a savings account you also have an opportunity in making more money. The money in your savings account earns interest which means the money you leave in the savings account the banks pays you for it. The bank also loan out money to people and charge an interest rate on the loan than what they pay you for your account. Something to remember with a savings account is that your money will always be in your account, the bank pays you back. They just loan it out so they have a chance to make money.

Another tip on saving money is when you get paid split up the whole paycheck in two's. Make one portion of the money that you save and make the other portion of the money that you can spend. For example if your paycheck is \$1,000 and you want to spend 60% of the check and save 40% you would spend \$600 and save \$400. If you keep doing that your money will keep piling up and you save up over \$1,000. For this method you don't need a savings account you could do this from your checking account if you can handle it.

Finally, the last step on managing your budget is to set short-term and long-term goals for yourself. For example set a short-term goal you want to achieve in 1-3 years and set a long-term goal you want to achieve in 4 or more years. Some examples of short-term goals are vacations, down payments for a car or presents or gifts. Some examples of long-term goals are retirement plans, your children's education or buying a house. These are just goals and not everyone accomplishes their goals but when you do you will feel good. Even if you decide not to accomplish the short or long-term, you will still have a lot of money left over from just saving.

Of course, managing your budget will not happen overnight it is going to take some time. But if you decide to take all of these steps into consideration you should be on the right track and should have a lot of money saved up.

The four genres of music being talked about today is Hip-Hop, R&B, Country and Reggae.

Hip-Hop originated in South Bronx, New York in the late 1970's by Clive Campbell a native from Jamaica. Hip-Hop has many subgenres. Some examples are Alternative Hip-Hop, Battle Rap, East Coast Hip-Hop, Gangsta Rap, West Coast Hip-Hop, Trap Music and many more. African Americans make up majority of Hip-Hop listeners with 40 percent which doubles the population of Caucasian listeners per capita. The most well-known Hip-Hop artist of all time could range from Jay-Z, Dr. Dre, Kanye West, Tupac, The Notorious B.I.G, 50 Cent and many more. Popular songs from the Hip-Hop genre include *Dear Mama* by Tupac, *Nuthin' but a G*

Thang by Dr. Dre, *99 Problems* by Jay-Z, *Many Men* by 50 Cent, *Juicy* by The Notorious B.I.G and *Heartless* by Kanye West.

R&B started in African American communities in the 1940's by Jerry Wexler a native from the Bronx. R&B has subgenres but not as much as HipHop. The subgenre of R&B include Disco, Adult Contemporary R&B, Motown, New Jack Swing, Soul and more. African Americans make up 53 percent of listeners while Caucasian make up 32 percent while Hispanics make up 15% of listeners. R&B has a lot of popular artists ranging from Stevie Wonder, Michael Jackson, Marvin Gaye, Alicia Keys, Janet Jackson, Aretha Franklin and much more. Popular songs from the artists named are *Superstition* by Stevie Wonder, *Billie Jean* by Michael Jackson, *Ain't No Mountain High Enough* by Marvin Gaye, *Girl on Fire* by Alicia Keys, *That's the Way Love Goes* by Janet Jackson and *I Never Loved A Man* by Aretha Franklin.

Country music arised in southern United States by Jimmy Rodgers a Mississippi native. Country music has subgenres but not as many as HipHop and R&B. The subgenres include Country Gospel, Honky Tonk, Urban Cowboy, Bluegrass, Americana and a couple more. Caucasian makes up 54 percent of listeners while Hispanics make up 38 percent of listeners and African Americans make up 8 percent of listeners. Some notorious Country music artists are Billy Ray Cyrus, George Strait, Carrie Underwood, Johnny Cash, and Dolly Parton. Some popular songs from the artists include *Achy Breaky Heart* by Billy Ray Cyrus, *I Cross My Heart* by George Strait, *Jesus Take the Wheel* by Carrie Underwood, *Hurt* by Johnny Cash and *9-5* by Dolly Parton.

Reggae music commenced in Jamaica by Bob Marley. Reggae has several subgenres including Mento, Ska, Rocksteady, Dancehall, Dub, Rockers and many more. A large majority

of Reggae listeners are mostly African Americans. Some popular Reggae artists are Bob Marley, Buju Banton, Alpha Blondy, Ziggy Marley, Luciano and many more. Some popular songs from the artist above are *Three Little Birds* by Bob Marley, *True to Myself* by Ziggy Marley, *Sweet Fanta Diallo* by Alpha Blondy, *Boom Bye Eye* by Buju Banton and *Lord Give Me Strength* by Luciano.

These four Genres are all examples of Classification and Division. There are many different music genres that can be classified by history, subgenre, listeners, popular artists and song examples.
